

Please Visit the Okaya Art and Archaeological Museum!

This Museum of Art and Archaeology features local art and archaeological artifacts from the Okaya area in Nagano, Japan.

You can view ancient Jomon pottery, historical tools, and traditional crafts, as well as paintings and sculptures by local artists.

It is a great place to learn about the history and culture of this region in a quiet and relaxed setting.

The museum is about a 5-minute walk from JR Okaya Station.

Opening hours are from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM.

The museum is closed every Wednesday, the day after national holidays, and from December 29 to January 3. (The museum may also close temporarily on other days.)

The admission fee for adults is 420 yen. (Admission to special exhibitions is charged separately.)

Visitors can also enjoy seasonal exhibitions and special exhibitions throughout the year.

Whether you are interested in Japanese history, archaeology, or local art, the Okaya Art and Archaeological Museum offers a unique cultural experience for visitors of all ages.
